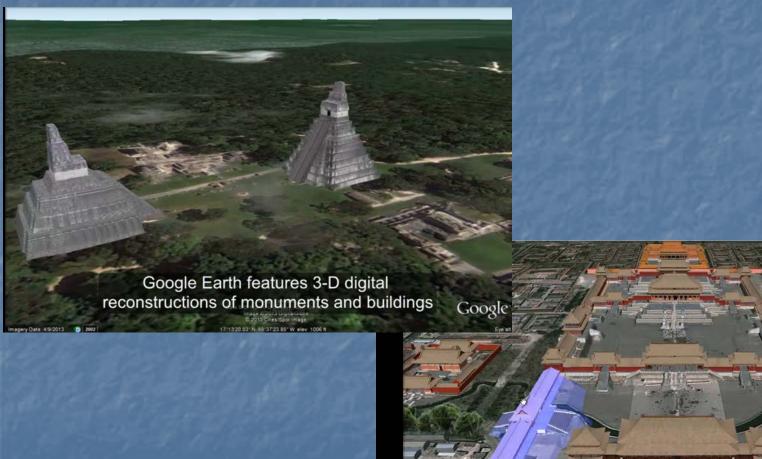
Using Virtual Tours

- 1) Provide instructions that will talk them through what you want them to see, OR...
- **2)** Include a summative activity like a quiz afterward.
- 2) Design "treasure hunt" or competition activities for students to complete as part of the tour.
- 4) Create feedback to Canvas (credit or grade)

Creating Virtual Tours

- Screenshot (PC: Function/print screen, Mac: command/shift/3)
 - add hotspots
- Screen capture (Camtasia, VLC Media)
 - Edit video (Camtasia, iMovie, Adobe Premiere)
 - Add subtitles, voiceover narration, or hotspots
